### Transforming Academic Writing: Harnessing the Power of AI for Enhanced Scholarly Communication

#### Introduction

Artificial Intelligence (AI) refers to the collection of technological innovations and techniques that imitate and extend human intelligence (Zhu, 2020). Artificial Intelligence (AI) has revolutionized many aspects of our existence, and its influence on writing and communication is growing. AI refers to developing computer systems that can perform tasks that typically require human intellect, such as comprehending natural language, generating text, and assisting in various domains. In the context of writing, AI-powered tools have emerged as valuable companions, offering students, researchers, and professionals support and augmenting the writing process.

Academic writing is a fundamental component of scholastic communication, as it facilitates the dissemination of knowledge and promotes intellectual development. However, writing a quality academic paper can take time and effort for researchers. The advent of AI has brought transformative solutions to the field of academic writing. Researchers can improve the content and efficacy of their scholarly communication by utilizing AI tools. Using specific examples of AI tools that have made significant contributions to the field, this article will examine how AI is revolutionizing academic writing.

## AI for Academic Library

Introducing AI in administrative proficiency in the academic library environment represents a transformative shift toward operational efficiency. The automation potential of AI extends to routine tasks typically associated with library management, such as lending and returning materials. By mechanizing these tasks, AI liberates the academic library staff from repetitive, time-consuming duties, redirecting their expertise towards more nuanced and intellectual pursuits, such as complex research assistance and personalized student guidance. Consequently, this allows the academic library to function beyond its traditional capacity as a mere knowledge repository. Instead, it evolves into an active participant in the educational process, directly fostering scholarly discourse, nurturing critical thinking, and facilitating more profound engagement with academic resources. AI's role in the realm of administrative efficiency, thus, becomes instrumental in the redefinition and amplification of the academic library's contribution to the intellectual vitality of the institution it serves.

## Automated Language Editing

Poorly constructed sentences, grammatical errors, and awkward phrasing can hinder the effective communication of research findings. AI-powered language editing tools have become indispensable resources for researchers seeking to enhance the readability and coherence of their work. These tools employ advanced algorithms to detect and correct grammatical mistakes, suggest improvements in sentence structure, and provide vocabulary suggestions. (Lee et al., 2021) By using these AI tools, researchers can streamline the writing process and produce polished manuscripts with greater ease.

- **Grammarly** is a popular AI writing assistant that aids in the improvement of grammar, spelling, and punctuation. In addition, it provides suggestions for enhancing your writing style.
- **ProWritingAid** is a widely recognized AI writing assistant with comparable features to Grammarly. In addition, it contains a plagiarism detector and a style guide.
- **The Hemingway Editor** is a tool that facilitates plain and concise writing. It identifies portions of your writing that are difficult to read or comprehend and provides suggestions for enhancement.
- **Cliche Finder** is a tool that helps you recognize and eliminate clichés in your writing. It can also help you identify and replace repetitive phrases and terms.

- **Wordtune** is a tool that rewrites your sentences to make them more engaging and fascinating. It provides alternative phrasing and sentence structure suggestions.

## Citation and Referencing Support

Citation and referencing play a crucial role in academic writing. Students often encounter difficulties with paraphrasing, referencing, and using quotes (Noori, 2020). Accurate citation and referencing are vital components of academic writing, ensuring that proper credit is given to the original authors and that the work can be validated and built upon. However, formatting references according to specific citation styles, such as APA or MLA, can be tedious and prone to errors. AI citation tools, such as Zotero, Mendeley and EndNote, have simplified this process by automatically generating citations and bibliographies in the desired format. These tools can extract metadata from research articles and books, allowing researchers to compile and manage their reference lists effortlessly.

- **Cite This For Me** is a free online tool that can generate citations in APA, MLA, and Chicago formats. Additionally, it allows you to save your citations for future use.
- **EasyBib** is an additional free online tool for generating citations in various formats. Also included is a plagiarism checker.



## Plagiarism Detection

Maintaining academic integrity is of utmost importance in scholarly writing. Plagiarism, whether intentional or unintentional, undermines the credibility of research and compromises the integrity of the academic community. AI-powered plagiarism detection tools, such as Turnitin and Copyscape, employ sophisticated algorithms to compare a submitted document with a vast database of academic literature and internet sources. These tools highlight any instances of potential plagiarism, enabling researchers to rectify unintentional errors and ensure the originality of their work.

- **PlagScan** is a plagiarism detection tool powered by AI that can scan documents for unoriginal content. PlagScan compares submitted papers to a database of billions of online sources and generates comprehensive reports on potential plagiarism instances.
- **Quetext** is a plagiarism detection and citation assistant enabled by machine learning that can be used to ensure the originality of your work. Quetext compares submitted papers to a database of billions of online sources and generates comprehensive reports on potential instances of plagiarism.
- **Copyscape** is a tool for detecting and preventing instances of plagiarism. To find correlations, it compares your content against billions of web pages and other content sources.



## Conclusion

In conclusion, incorporating artificial intelligence (AI) into academic writing has given researchers and professionals game-changing answers. The writing process has been transformed by AI-powered technologies that streamline operations and improve the standard of scholarly communication. In university libraries, these tools have simplified administrative work, freeing employees to concentrate on more complex and intellectual activities and reframing the library's position as an active participant in stimulating scholarly conversation. AI tools are now essential resources for language editing, providing grammatical improvements, sentence structure enhancements, and vocabulary suggestions, resulting in more polished writing. Additionally, the creation of sources along with maintaining reference lists has been made simpler by AI citation and referencing support tools, saving researchers' time and guaranteeing accurate referencing. Additionally, AI-powered plagiarism detection technologies are now essential for ensuring academic integrity due to their support to researchers in finding and correcting instances of possible plagiarism and preserving the integrity of the academic community.



It's crucial to remember that artificial intelligence (AI) is an asset instead of a substitute for human intelligence. While AI tools complement and augment researchers' work, their critical thinking and creativity are still crucial to the educational process. Researchers can open new doors for scholarly communication and create methods for academic writing that are more productive and efficient by embracing AI's potential and utilizing its capability. The continued use of AI in academic writing can expand the scope of our comprehension and improve the standard of scholarly work, which would be advantageous to researchers and the academic community.

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**FEATURE ARTICLE****ChatGPT: Opportunities and Challenges of Integrating AI in Higher Education in Sri Lanka**

**What is ChatGPT?**

ChatGPT is a computer program powered by artificial intelligence (AI) that can quickly answer questions. It's a chatbot that can go back-and-forth with the user in text (McCray, 2023). Therefore, individuals who use this tool can enter a question or prompt, then ChatGPT will provide a well-articulated written response. ChatGPT came into the scene in late November 2022 and immediately gained immense popularity, attracting one million users within a week (Cox and Elias, 2023). This tool is developed by OpenAI, the same organization behind the innovative image generator DALL-E. ChatGPT is a large language model tool that uses advanced deep learning techniques to produce text in response to user queries. This language model tool can write emails, poems, business plans and computer code. Further, if users feed it a report or paper, and it will offer feedback and revisions. More generally, ChatGPT will do paraphrasing, and making summaries. Rather than searching the internet for information, ChatGPT has been trained on a vast collection of text, including academic articles, news stories, books, websites, and other sources.

The utilization of ChatGPT is currently in its initial stage within the higher education sector in Sri Lanka. Therefore, looking at the opportunities and challenges of using ChatGPT for learning is essential. However, it will be up to individual departments and academics to decide how they best see the potential and pitfalls of using ChatGPT as a tool in their programs.

This article simply outlines some of the opportunities and challenges of using ChatGPT.

By utilizing ChatGPT for basic information searches, similar to other search engine tools, students can gain insight into the type of information that can and cannot be obtained using AI.</p>	<p>ChatGPT produce text in an authoritative tone, which could potentially create a misconception among students that all information provided by ChatGPT is accurate. However, it is important to note that the data set used by ChatGPT is restricted and, therefore, may contain inaccurate data or misinformation.</p>
<p>ChatGPT can serve as a useful tool for students to generate initial ideas and concepts while preparing to write or brainstorm responses to a given prompt.</p>	<p>ChatGPT is a tool designed for profit, which collects data from users who provide input. Although it is currently free to use, it is expected to be monetized in the future. The developers of ChatGPT have not disclosed their plans for using the data collected from users. By using ChatGPT, users agree to the possibility of OpenAI's, the developers of ChatGPT's, potential storing and selling of personal data.</p>

<p>ChatGPT can give some writers a template for producing write-ups in a specific type i.e. a 5-paragraph essay, an abstract, a cover letter, or an interview template etc. The ChatGPT generated content of the writing could be inaccurate, but the structure and style of the writing may be reflecting the requirements and standards expected for the assignment or task.</p>	<p>Using ChatGPT's dataset raises issues such as ethical use of information and plagiarism.</p>
	<p>Engaging with ChatGPT has economic and environmental consequences. Large Language Models (LLMs) like ChatGPT demand massive computing power, which can only be afforded by big tech companies. Running any technology requiring major computing processes has an environmental impact, as computing processing facilities will need to be built with facilities that require even larger power and cooling resources.</p>

The development of technology such as ChatGPT is ongoing and it's possible that recommendations regarding its usage will change over time. This will therefore open new research venues in Sri Lanka's higher education sector to see how students can effectively utilize this tool for educational purposes or how academics could integrate them into teaching and learning in the future at different levels or building up new institutional level policies for using AI-powered tools.

Moreover, the University library continues to fulfil its role as the heart of the university, despite its move a little bit away from print and towards electronic resources. It is very hard to predict how AI tools will impact librarianship. This situation again creates future research areas for the university libraries in Sri Lanka to examine how librarians could integrate these new tools into what they do or how they could help their users to use AI-powered tools wisely, safely, and ethically to improve the output quality.

Sri Lankan higher education sector can accept the AI technology for teaching and learning purposes upon thorough assessment of the novel tools and creating services to facilitate their utilization.

## NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT/ COMMUNITY OUTREACH

### National Union Catalogue of Sri Lanka is Launched

National Union Catalogue of Sri Lanka is officially launched by the National Library and Documentation Service Board on 26<sup>th</sup> April, 2023. National Union Catalogue is developed with the objective of providing a common discovery interface to search and find the bibliographic details of books in all over the libraries in Sri Lanka.





Mr. M. N. Ravikumar, Senior Assistant Librarian, Eastern University Sri Lanka has developed this portal using the VuFind open-source software. This interface does more than simply search; it also shows the location of the book and the libraries where it is currently located with the live status (availability) of the book. So, any user could use this Union Catalogue to find their required book without visiting several library catalogues (OPACs) which will save time of user and they can visit the nearest library to refer the book. This is a joint



project of the National Library and ICTA. So far OPAC of 25 Public libraries are incorporated into this Union Catalogue as the initial step and other libraries such as University libraries and special libraries in Sri Lanka will be incorporated in the near future. ### Workshop on classification of library books

Through the zonal education director of Mathugama, Professor Lakdas Fernando, former academic staff member from the department of Textile and Apparel Engineering, Faculty of Engineering requested the guidance for a workshop on classification of library books. A group of 40 teacher librarians attached to the school libraries of Mathugama zonal education area were the participants. The venue of the workshop was Dickhena College located at Baduraliya, Mathugama.

Under the patronage of librarian, Mrs. R.C. Kodikara, Senior Assistant Librarian, Mrs Upeksha Kodithuwakku conducted the theory and practical sessions during the one-day workshop on 28<sup>th</sup> April. The workshop consisted of a session on importance of classification and a practical session on classifying library books using Dewey Decimal Classification. The practical session was held at the newly renovated library of Dickhena college, Mathugama. The participants enthusiastically attended the practical session to obtain knowledge on classification and shelving library materials. During the conclusion remarks, Principal of Dickhena College, Zonal education directors and few participants expressed the importance of the workshop and need for continuation of the programme for zonal areas around Mathugama education zone.





### **Browsing library resources in Koha management software**

The training Director, the librarian and a group of students from Sri Lanka Institute of Textile Apparel (SLITA) located at Rathmalana visited the library premises on May 24<sup>th</sup> and they were welcomed by the acting Librarian, Mr. Anura Kiriella. The attendees were offered a hands-on experience about browsing library resources in Koha management software. The resource person, Senior Assistant Librarian, Mrs. Upeksha Kodithuwakku conducted the session on using a library, library ethics and finding information related to their academic discipline. The students were able to find out various library resources during the library tour.



### **Awareness session and library visit for Hapugahakumbura Vidyalaya, Balangoda**

The library SUSL conducted an awareness session for the students Grade 6-11 of R/Hapugahakumbura Maha Vidyalaya, Kahatapitiya, Balangoda on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2023. The librarian, Mrs. T.N. Neighsoorei gave an introduction to the library, its functions and formations and Ms. Thrishala Warnasooriya, Assistant Librarian explained and demonstrated the functions and services of KOHA library management system, newly introduced library services, sections, projects and effective use of social media to promote the library.



The librarian donated a book collection, stationery and a designed SUSL library book mark for all students and the staff at the end of the session.



### *'Prison Library project' at the Jaffna Remand Prison - Library, University of Jaffna*

'Prison Library Project' at the Jaffna Remand Prison is an important community outreach initiative undertaken by the Library of the University of Jaffna. This activity was led by Mr. R. Kupeshan, Senior Assistant Librarian and Coordinator of Community Outreach Activities, and a team comprising of eight members engaged in organizing the respective library specifically for prisoners at the Jaffna Remand Prison.





This endeavor, carried out from August 2022 to March 2023, marked a significant milestone in their community engagement efforts. Through the project, a collection of 2,500 reading materials, including books, reference sources, serials, pamphlets, and leaflets were technically processed and organized. Additionally, infrastructure facilities were developed with the support of philanthropists and well-wishers. An operational mechanism was also devised to address the information needs of the inmates. The inaugural ceremony for the 'Prison Library' took place on April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023, with Professor S. Srisatkunarajah, Vice Chancellor of the University of Jaffna, as the Chief Guest.

**First Anniversary Celebration of Research Lounge**

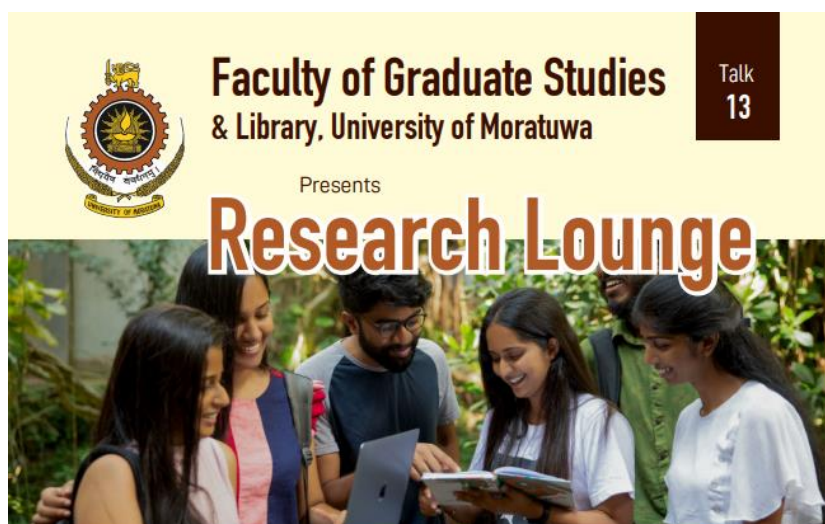

Research Lounge has successfully conducted its twelve talks in accordance with the guidance and direction of the Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Prof. Ajith De Alwis and came to fruition to the satisfaction of every stakeholder to it.





National and international academics, researchers, and students took part in this process. In some research lounges, they discussed simple topics like how to start a research project, innovative research, etc. In another one, they opened participants' eyes to new topics like Thesis writing with R markdown, Latex. ### **Empowering BSc Zoology Students with Research Methodology Lectures**

Dr. A.U. Weerakoon, Senior Assistant Librarian at the Open University of Sri Lanka (OUSL), conducted a series of lectures for BSc Zoology special degree students, focusing on research methodology. Held from May to June, these sessions provided essential insights and tools to enhance students' understanding of the research process.

The lectures commenced with mind mapping as a tool for research students, teaching effective organization of thoughts and improved research planning. Information searching and evaluating techniques were then explored, enabling students to conduct comprehensive and efficient searches while critically assessing sources for credibility and relevance. The third lecture was focused on Referencing rules and reference management emphasizing proper citation and avoiding plagiarism. The final lecture covered the publication process for scientific research papers including journal selection, and the peer-review system.

### **Reference Management with Zotero for MSc in Nursing Students**

Weerakoon, Senior Assistant Librarian at the Open University of Sri Lanka (OUSL), has been invited to conduct a session on reference management with Zotero for the participants of the MSc in Nursing program. This lecture, a part of the research methodology course, was held on the 10<sup>th</sup> of May 2023.

Participants gained invaluable insights into the functionalities and features of Zotero, enabling them to efficiently manage references, generate bibliographies, and maintain accurate citations. The students were guided through practical demonstrations, ensuring they grasp the full potential of Zotero as a research aid.

**Human Library- 2023, University of Colombo**

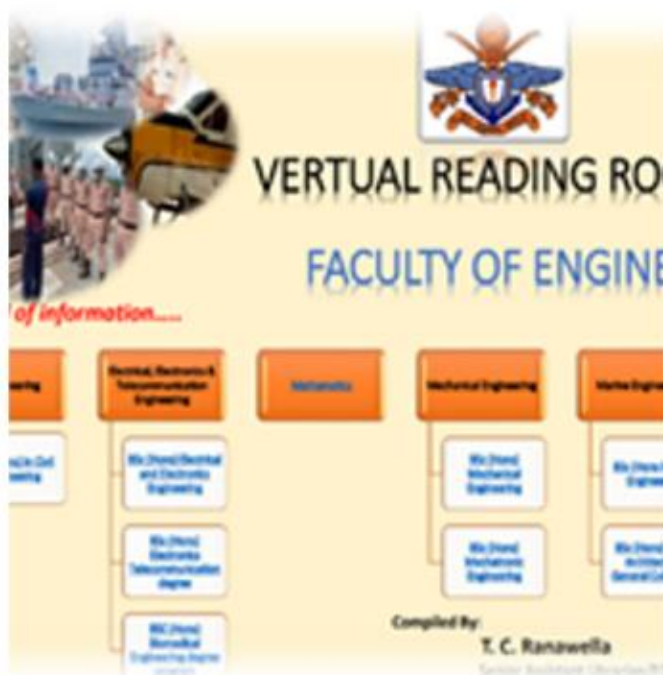
