From Traditional to Multifaceted: Role of University Libraries in Empowering students of the current era

The library has conventionally been viewed as the "heart of the university," tasked with delivering services to the institution's academic community. In this era of abundant digital knowledge and declining academic prestige, university libraries are undergoing a subtle yet significant transformation. Students of the current era who skillfully navigate vast and complex digital information landscapes, prioritise personalised and collaborative learning experiences, and demonstrate greater autonomy and critical thinking are key drivers of this transformation. Due to the emergence of a student-centred paradigm and innovative pedagogical approaches, there is a necessity to highlight the roles and responsibilities of librarians in the educational process. Once seen as relaxing spaces for lending books, these institutions are now crucial in shaping the academic paths of students in the current era, and their evolution may impact the future of higher education in the country. Therefore, numerous new initiatives are being successfully implemented in university libraries nationwide today.

From physical books to scholarly centres

University libraries have historically served as repositories of knowledge, offering access to textbooks, examination papers, and reference materials. Contemporary university students face numerous challenges, including navigating extensive online resources, avoiding misinformation, acquiring suitable research methodologies, and understanding the concept of academic integrity.

This alteration in student requirements is driving libraries to transform from simple repositories of books to scholarly centres. Now, University libraries offer access to comprehensive collections of physical books, journals, databases, palm leaf collections and diverse materials in both print and digital formats, thereby ensuring that students can obtain the information necessary for their academic pursuits. Furthermore, university libraries support their academic communities by offering digital platforms, such as digital walls, which provide access to digital library resources and services from other institutions as well.

From halls to study spaces

University libraries provide quiet and collaborative study spaces with the most conducive environments for studying and learning, including quiet study areas, computer labs with modern technology, wi-fi access with high bandwidth, and group study rooms with good lighting, ventilation, air conditioning, calming, and a wide range of suitable and attractive furniture for individual and group learning requirements.

Furthermore, they create spaces to minimize knowledge gaps by allowing computers with Internet access and reference materials to be used concurrently in study areas. Almost all university libraries offer students 24/7 study rooms in a friendly environment.

Aside from study areas, modern university libraries are increasingly recognized as vital learning environments. Today's university libraries serve as a primary hub for the university community, organising academic events such as book launches, specialised workshops, and guest lectures.

• Bridging the information gap

Academic librarians in universities maintain that their responsibilities extend beyond regulating information access; they also facilitate critical thinking and learning. The promotion of information literacy, which is the ability to locate, evaluate, and utilize information effectively, is a significant function that university libraries are currently assuming. Libraries conduct user education programs and seminars to equip students with the necessary information literacy skills, including the ability to effectively evaluate information, conduct research, and utilize library resources effectively. This is particularly crucial for undergraduates, as a significant number of them arrive at university with limited experience in academic research or using scholarly databases. The programs provided by university libraries facilitate the acquisition of lifelong learning skills and advanced learning.

Nearly all universities have established workshops and credit-bearing modules that focus on information literacy for undergraduate students. These programs provide students with the necessary skills to access peer-reviewed journals, correctly cite sources, and avoid plagiarism, which are essential in both academic and professional settings.

• Manual systems to innovative technology

University libraries frequently incorporate emerging technologies, including security doors, access controls, self-service check-in and check-out systems, Kiosks, online learning tools such as e-book platforms, grammar checking and plagiarism detection tools, as well as information management systems like open-source library integration software, reference management software, and digital resource management software. The adoption of these technologies surpasses temporal limitations and facilitates the preparation of students as dedicated professionals for the nation.

• From in-university activities to community engagement

Outreach has emerged as an essential component in broadening academic contributions beyond the university, engaging with the broader community, and fostering literacy and lifelong learning. Given the evolving role of university librarians in facilitating academic success, it is essential to provide detailed guidance and implement outreach programs as an ongoing initiative by librarians. Consequently, a majority of university libraries investigate their role in supporting broader, specific communities, such as public libraries, technical colleges, and schools, by providing resources and programs aimed at empowering disadvantaged individuals and contributing to national development.

Moreover, present-day university libraries collaborate with various special libraries and institutions to facilitate the exchange of information and expertise. Librarians provide expertise as resource individuals for a range of literacy and research support initiatives tailored to specific researchers.

These programs offer significant benefits for both external communities and academic librarians. Academic librarians have the potential to transform the library's image, role, and services to the public. They can present themselves as valuable human resources, illuminate various career aspects, and engage in supporting communities. Additionally, they can raise awareness of new technologies among external communities and foster relationships that benefit both parties.

• From providing information to making a greater contribution to research

Modern-day university libraries play a significant role in fostering the research culture within their institutions. Nearly all universities, in addition to offering contemporary resources and services that foster a robust research culture, also provide knowledgeable personnel to facilitate numerous programs. These include access to scholarly databases, support with citation management, guidance on referencing to prevent plagiarism, utilization of reference management and plagiarism detection tools, as well as instruction on research methodologies, literature reviews, and academic writing. Libraries facilitate research students in accessing essential information from networked libraries when such resources are unavailable at their home institutions. Furthermore, research students are granted permission to consult other university libraries as required.

In addition to these offerings, specific university libraries extend personalized research assistance in various formats, including guidance on research methodologies, techniques, analytical tools, and software, facilitated through their dedicated Research Support Units.

Furthermore, university libraries play a pivotal role in organizing annual conferences and research symposia, thereby facilitating the academic community's opportunity to disseminate their scholarly contributions.

From standard services to innovative services

To align with the academic success of contemporary students, university librarians are increasingly offering a wide range of innovative services. University libraries are increasingly implementing human libraries to offer their patrons an alternative experience by providing access to expert individuals rather than books for borrowing. "People with a particular personal experience or perspective on life" are often stereotyped and volunteer to serve as "human books." These human texts consent to engage in open dialogue with other members of the community, who are referred to as "readers."

Additionally, the university libraries extend their succour to alleviate the language barriers that their academic community faces. English Learning Zones are maintained by some university libraries, which provide access to self-learning English through the use of simple workbooks and storybooks. These zones also conduct programs during designated time slots, with the participation of English department lecturers, and maintain websites that offer engaging videos and online resources to help overcome the language barrier.

Additionally, specific libraries offer specialized services, including laptop lending, conference facilities, and resource centres for the visually impaired, to ensure all students have access to the same level of academic success.

• From isolated places to cultural enrichment

The university libraries are no longer isolated centres. Libraries contain art exhibits, historical collections, and various cultural resources. Specific university libraries preserve traditional knowledge through ola-leaf collections and offer access to both their academic communities and researchers nationwide. University libraries also host art exhibitions and various other events on their premises. In certain instances, they collaborate with other universities and institutions to organize exhibitions

• Safeguarding academic heritage in a multifaceted learning environment

Libraries safeguard historical documents, rare books, and various materials pertinent to the university's history and research, which are available in both physical and digital formats for use by the academic community in specific subject areas within universities. Librarians and relevant personnel participate in training programs on preservation and archiving, continually updating their knowledge.

The contributions indicated in the preceding points are most often provided by university libraries, with specific libraries potentially fulfilling extra-specific functions peculiar to their institutions.

A call for integration by looking ahead

The university libraries are currently at a pivotal juncture. They need to continue changing by embracing technology, advocating for information literacy, and clearly expressing their role in Gen C education to remain relevant and influential.

The lack of faculty-library collaboration in certain universities is one of the most significant difficulties that face the structure. In such universities, librarians are still perceived as being on the periphery of the entire teaching process, rather than being considered collaborators. As a result, specialists recommend that librarians be included in the curriculum creation process, particularly for courses with research components. For this to occur, librarians require further recognition of the role they play in the growth of academia. To accomplish this, it will be necessary to receive assistance from the university administrators, the University Grants Commission, and the Ministry of Education.

In an era marked by an overwhelming abundance of information and a shortage of discernment, university libraries have the potential to serve as intellectual anchors, providing access to knowledge while supporting its thoughtful application. When empowered and supported, they can help foster the conditions under which wisdom may emerge.

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Gamification in Academic Library Services: Engaging the Next Generation of University Learners



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Introduction

In the 21st century, academic libraries are undergoing a fundamental transformation to remain pedagogically relevant in an era shaped by digital fluency, user-centred learning, and technological innovation. In response to the growing demand for interactive and immersive learning experiences, academic libraries worldwide are incorporating gamification as a strategic approach to engage students, stimulate active participation, and enrich the overall learning process.

Gamification refers to the application of game design elements such as points, levels, badges,leader oards, and challenges in non-game settings to enhance user engagement, increase motivation, and promote learning (Mushtaq et al., 2025). Far from being merely entertainment, gamification is now recognized as a valuable instructional strategy. In the Sri Lankan context, it is essential to explore how gamification is being implemented in university library services to support student learning, promote information literacy, and encourage user participation within higher education settings.

Gamification in Academic Libraries

In academic library settings, gamification is employed as a pedagogical strategy to enhance the interactivity and effectiveness of learning experiences. Rather than making education superficial, it embeds learning outcomes into fun and rewarding activities. Common application areas include:

- First-year library orientations: Introducing new students to library spaces, services, and tools in an engaging way.
- Information literacy instruction: Making workshops on searching, evaluating, and citing in formation more participatory.
- Citation and research skills workshops: Encouraging skill development through point-based tasks or quiz games.
- Reading and scholarly communication challenges: Promoting continuous engagement with reading and research tasks.

By structuring educational content into challenges or tasks, students are more likely to stay motivated, participate actively, and retain what they learn (15 Effective Strategies to Boost Student Engagement, 2025).

Gamified Applications in University Library Contexts

1. Interactive Orientation Experiences

Gamified orientation programs are increasingly used to help new students explore the library in an enjoyable, tech-enhanced way. For example, North Carolina State University Libraries created WolfWalk, a mobile-based scavenger hunt that allows students to follow QR-coded clues to discover various library locations and services (Burke et al., 2012). In Sri Lanka, university libraries can replicate this approach by utilizing simple tools, such as Google Forms, QR codes, or platforms like Actionbound, to guide students as they earn points and complete challenges.

2. Escape Rooms for Information Literacy

Escape rooms utilize puzzles and collaborative challenges to teach students research and citation skills engagingly. At the University of North Texas, students participated in an "Escape the Library" event, where they solved information-related clues within a time limit (Robson, 2025). In Sri Lanka, low-tech escape room activities utilizing printed clues and small-group collaboration could be developed to reinforce key concepts of information literacy.

3. Digital Badging for Learning Incentives

Digital badges serve as virtual rewards or micro-credentials for completing specific learning tasks. At Indiana University Bloomington, students earn badges for completing modules on academic integrity, referencing styles, or database use (Tin, 2020). Sri Lankan libraries can utilize platforms like Moodle to award badges for mastery of IL skills and participation in workshops, thereby encouraging self-paced learning and student achievement.

4. Research Skill Challenges and Leaderboards

Libraries may run research-based competitions where students earn points or appear on leaderboards for completing specific tasks such as attending consultations, exploring databases, or submitting research strategies. This method, commonly used in Western universities, could be piloted during undergraduate research modules in Sri Lankan institutions to encourage early engagement

Benefits of Gamification in Academic Libraries

Gamification offers a range of educational and motivational benefits:

- **Enhanced motivation**: Reward systems and visible progress tracking encourage active participation (Hamari et al., 2014).
- **Active learning**: Interactive tasks help students internalize skills through practice rather than passive observation.
- **Student-centred engagement**: Games promote learner autonomy and align with constructivist educational principles.
- **Increased service use**: Gamified challenges help students discover underutilized resources and services

These benefits position gamification not only as an engagement tool but also as a method for deeper, more meaningful learning.

Challenges and Recommendations

Despite its potential, integrating gamification into academic library services presents several challenges, particularly in the Sri Lankan context:

- **Limited technological infrastructure**: Many libraries lack the digital tools or platforms to host gamified features.
- **Staff capacity and training needs**: Librarians may lack experience in instructional de sign and digital gamification tools.
- **Scepticism toward non-traditional methods**: Some educators and administrators may perceive gamification as lacking academic seriousness.
- **Student diversity and accessibility**: Not all students are motivated by competitive ap proaches, and digital inclusion remains a concern.
- **Program sustainability:** Gamified tools require regular updates, feedback loops, and resources for long-term success.

Recommendations

To address these issues, the following steps are recommended:

- **Start small using free tools**: Try printed scavenger hunts or Google Form quizzes before moving to digital platforms.
- Leverage existing platforms: Integrate gamification into LMS tools like Moodle to reduce overhead.
- **Train and collaborate**: Offer librarian training and foster partnerships with IT staff and faculty.
- **Build institutional support** by sharing success stories, student feedback, and international case studies to raise awareness and promote a positive image.
- **Design inclusively** by offering both digital and physical versions to accommodate diverse needs.
- **Monitor and evaluate**: Utilise surveys, participation data, and user feedback to assess the impact of gamified programs and inform subsequent improvements.

While international models highlight the impact of gamification in library contexts, there is a need to explore its practical applications in Sri Lankan universities. In the absence of documented local case studies, two hypothetical yet feasible scenarios are proposed to demonstrate potential implementation. The first is a QR code-based orientation challenge that guides first-year students through key library areas using mobile devices and interactive tasks, fostering engagement and spatial familiarity.

The second involves a digital badge system integrated into the university's LMS (such as Moodle), where students earn badges for completing information literacy workshops and online assessments on referencing and research skills. These approaches rely on low-cost, readily available tools, such as Google Forms and existing learning platforms, making them practical, scalable, and well-aligned with the resource constraints and educational needs of Sri Lankan academic libraries.

A Way Forward for Sri Lanka

Gamification offers academic libraries a strategic and innovative approach to engaging the next generation of learners. By combining instructional objectives with playful elements, libraries can encourage deeper learning, foster digital fluency, and increase service usage. Even with limited budgets, Sri Lankan university libraries can successfully pilot gamification initiatives, such as digital badges or interactive scavenger hunts, by creatively utilizing existing resources. These efforts can modernise library services and help students maximise their academic experience.

Webinar No. 03 – Academic Libraries and the Advancement of Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) and Professional Development



Regional & International Collaboration

International Conference on Library and Information Science (ICLIS 2025) at the University of Peradeniya

The International Conference on Library and Information Science (ICLIS 2025) was successfully held on 26th and 27th June 2025 at the University of Peradeniya, convening a distinguished gathering of professionals, scholars, and academics from the global Library and Information Science community. This prestigious event was jointly organized by the Library of the University of Peradeniya, the Sri Lanka Library Association (SLLA), and the National Science Foundation (NSF) of Sri Lanka, with additional support extended by the Sri Lanka Convention Bureau.





Centred around the theme "Libraries as Pillars of Sustainable Socio-Cultural Capital," the conference emphasised the dynamic and multifaceted roles of libraries in preserving cultural heritage, fostering intellectual discourse, promoting lifelong learning, and advancing sustainable societal development.

The inaugural ceremony was held at the Diamond Jubilee Hall, Faculty of Agriculture, while the technical sessions were conducted across eight parallel tracks at the Department of Geography and the Main Library premises of the University. A total of 114 abstracts were received, out of which 71 were accepted, published in the conference proceedings, and presented under the following sub-themes:

- Emerging Trends in Information Services
- Empowering Tourism and Driving Growth
- Transformative Leadership in Librarianship
- IT Applications, Data Privacy, and Ethics in Information Access
- Library Outreach and Education in a Dynamic World
- Safeguarding Cultural Heritage for Future Generations
- Open Access and E-Learning as Tools for Library Innovation
- Connecting Library and Information Communities in the Digital and AI Era



The conference attracted over 75 international participants from countries including India, Nepal, the United Kingdom, and the Maldives, alongside more than 90 local library and information professionals. It served as a vibrant platform for knowledge exchange, scholarly collaboration, and professional development within the field.

The Chief Guest of the conference was Prof. Terrence Madhujith, Vice-Chancellor of the University of Peradeniya. The Keynote Address was delivered by Prof. R. Balasubramani of Bharathidasan University, India. Rev. Dr. Isabella Rajakumari, Principal of Holy Cross College, India, graced the occasion as the Guest of Honour, and Prof. Liyanage Amarakeerthi, an acclaimed literary scholar from the University of Peradeniya, delivered a special guest address.




International Librarians Networking - American Library Association

In his keynote, Dr. Jayasundara highlighted how Sri Lanka's Digital Economy Strategy 2030 and e-Sri Lanka initiative align with international frameworks like the UN Sustainable Development Goals, urging libraries to actively support these national and global agendas.

Academically, IRCL 2025 was a hub of rigorous research and dialogue. A total of 42 research papers were submitted, of which 29 were selected through a thorough peer-review process. The academic sessions featured over 30 presentations in Tamil and English, conducted across six parallel tracks, including two online sessions that facilitated international participation and showcased the conference's inclusive, global outlook.



The closing session was co-moderated by Prof. Ruwan Gamage and Dr. M. M. Mashroofa (Senior Assistant Librarian, South Eastern University of Sri Lanka). With its blend of academic excellence, cultural celebration, and international engagement, IRCL 2025 reaffirmed Eastern University's leadership in promoting knowledge sharing, innovation, and collaboration in the digital era of library services.

University of Kelaniya Contributes to EU-Funded Erasmus+ NSIS Project



The Library of the University of Kelaniya is a proud partner in the Erasmus+ Capacity Building in Higher Education (CBHE) project titled "Developing Information, Research, and Digital Skills for Business, Innovation and Entrepreneurship in India, Sri Lanka, and Nepal" (NSIS). Coordinated by the Technological University of the Shannon (Ireland) and supported by a €799,933.28 grant from the European Union, this three-year initiative (2024–2027) brings together institutions from Ireland, Germany, Greece, Romania, India, Sri Lanka, and Nepal. The project aims to enhance the role of Library and Information Science professionals in supporting research, business, and innovation across South Asian higher education institutions.

A key milestone of the project was the Didactic and Scientific Working Group Meeting, held from June 22 to 27, 2025, at Transilvania University of Braşov, Romania. Representatives from 14 partner institutions convened to assess project progress, develop harmonized curricula, and plan strategies for digital learning implementation. The University of Kelaniya was represented by Dr. C.C. Jayasundara, Librarian, and Dr. W.M.T.D. Ranasinghe, Senior Assistant Librarian. As part of the meeting outcomes, ten curriculum development teams were established to design the NSIS training modules collaboratively. Notably, both Dr. Jayasundara and Dr. Ranasinghe were appointed as team leaders for the development of two of these key modules.

National Development

NICD Students Visit the OUSL KRC Library

A group of 15 students following the Diploma in Information Technology programme at the National Institute of Corporate Development (NICD), Polgolla, visited the KRC Library for an educational exposure session on how libraries integrate Information Technology into their services. During the visit, library staff demonstrated the use of the KOHA Library Management System (LMS) for cataloguing, circulation, and user services. Students also observed the library's digitisation projects, the use of online databases and the delivery of off-campus services. The use of technology for security purposes and inventory management was also discussed. The one-day visit (19th June) provided students with practical insight into the evolving role of technology in modern library environments.

National Library and Documentation Services Board Workshop

The National Library and Documentation Services Board (NLDSB) conducted a two-day workshop for library teachers of Hatton Education Zone from 5-6th June 2025. Mr T. Ramanan served as a resource person at this library-training program held at Hatton Highland College on 6th June 2025. The topics he covered were i) library strategies to strengthen teaching and learning activities in schools and ii) preservation of library resources and library exterior-interior designs. Around 85 teacher librarians/library teachers participated and all of them actively engaged in a daylong session. Participants shared their positive feedback and requested to conduct training sessions in technical and ICT components.







Internship Programme Conducted by the Library of the University of Colombo

The Library of the University of Colombo successfully conducted a 20-day internship programme from January to April 2025 for the BA (Hons) in Library & Information Sciences students of the University of Kelaniya.

This internship was designed to provide students with comprehensive practical training in the core functions of a university library. Throughout the programme, students received guidance and mentorship from Senior Assistant Librarians and Assistant Librarians, who shared their professional expertise and insights.

The primary objective of the internship was to offer hands-on experience in various aspects of academic library operations, including cataloguing, circulation, reference services, digital resource management, and user education. The training served as a valuable opportunity for students to bridge theoretical knowledge with real-world practice in a professional academic setting.















Community Outreach Activities



- Mrs. Siyani Thevaruban, a Master's in Education student from the Open University of Sri Lanka, was recognized in the Tamil category, showcasing the strength and diversity of student research in local languages.

These awards reflect the academic excellence promoted through IRCL 2025 and highlight the commitment of Sri Lankan scholars to advancing knowledge and practice in the digital age of library science.

Eastern University Library Network Empowers Researchers through SCOPUS Awareness Session with Elsevier

The Library Network of Eastern University, Sri Lanka, in collaboration with Elsevier, organized an insightful awareness session on SCOPUS on $21^{\rm st}$ May 2025. The session was led by Mr. Vijay Reddi, Resource Professional from Elsevier, who provided an in-depth analysis of the university's research outputs indexed in SCOPUS and recognized some of the top researchers representing diverse disciplines.

Mr. Reddi emphasized the importance of publishing in high-quality, reputed indexed journals and guided participants on identifying suitable scholarly journals to enhance their research impact. He also shed light on the advantages and limitations of global journal ranking systems such as Q1, Q2, Q3, and Q4, and offered practical strategies to maximize the visibility and quality of research publications.

Highlighting both the strengths and areas for improvement, this session served as a valuable platform for the university's academic community to better align their research with global standards and elevate Eastern University's scholarly footprint.





Research Lounge - University of Moratuwa

The 26th Research Lounge was held on June 25, 2025, at the Faculty of Graduate Studies boardroom under the theme 'Ethics Unveiled: Navigating the Human Research Landscape'. Dr. Ishanka Talagala, Board Certified Specialist in Community Medicine, Chairperson of the Ethics Review Committee, Faculty of Medicine, University of Moratuwa, Head and Senior Lecturer, Department of Public Health and Family Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, University of Moratuwa and Dr. Nayani Gunawardhana, Senior Assistant Librarian, University of Moratuwa contributed to the session.

This discussion explored the fundamental ethical principles and guidelines that govern research involving human participants. It began with a historical overview of key events, such as the Nuremberg Trials, the Tuskegee Syphilis Study, and the development of the Belmont Report, which have shaped modern research ethics. Key ethical principles discussed included Respect for Persons, Beneficence, and Justice. In addition, the presentation discussed the role of Institutional Review Boards (IRBs), the concept of risk-benefit analysis, confidentiality, and the importance of voluntary participation. Special considerations for vulnerable populations, such as children, prisoners, and individuals with cognitive impairments, are also addressed.


Training session on reference management at SUSL
















Workshops on Research Tools and Data Analysis

Human Library Project: Event 08





By engaging regularly with the resource person, students can freely discuss their weaknesses and get practical advice and support. The interactive sessions encourage learners to become more confident in their use of English, especially in academic, social, and professional contexts. It also addresses common fears and anxieties students have about speaking English in public.

In addition to language improvement, the program supports the development of **soft skills** such as effective communication, presentation techniques, and interpersonal interaction, skills that are increasingly valued in both local and international career environments.

Overall, the Basha Buddy program represents an important step toward empowering the student community of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura. It helps students become more capable communicators and confident individuals, equipped to face the challenges of the modern world.
