Infophobia: The Modern Patron's Silent Struggle and the Library's Role as an Antidote

Introduction

In an age defined by the unprecedented abundance of information, a new and paradoxical anxiety has emerged within our communities. Patrons no longer walk into libraries primarily facing a scarcity of resources; instead, they are often paralysed by an overwhelming excess. The challenge is no longer finding information, but filtering it, evaluating it, and coping with the psychological toll of the constant deluge. This phenomenon has a name: Infophobia (Savolainen, 2007). While not yet a formal clinical diagnosis, the term "infophobia" from the Latin informatio (information) and Greek phobos (fear) is gaining traction in Library and Information Science (LIS) discourse to describe the pervasive apprehension, anxiety, and stress individuals experience when faced with the necessity of navigating complex information environments. Unlike technophobia, which is a fear of technology itself, infophobia is a content-based anxiety, a dread of the sheer volume, complexity, and often contradictory nature of the information one must process to function in society.

As Savolainen (2015) articulates in his work on everyday information practices, the "cognitive barriers" to information seeking are becoming significantly more pronounced. Individuals are not just avoiding complex searches; they are actively experiencing a stress response to the very prospect of wading through digital misinformation, scholarly paywalls, and the 24/7 news cycle. This has profound implications for the mission of libraries and the role of information professionals in today's world.

Identifying the Characteristics of Infophobia

Infophobia manifests in several key ways that will be familiar to any front-line librarian:

- 1. **Analysis Paralysis**: The inability to make a decision or begin a research task due to the perception of endless sources and the fear of choosing an inferior or incorrect one. A student might have fifty open browser tabs yet be unable to write a single sentence, overwhelmed by the possibilities.
- 2. **Information Avoidance**: A conscious or unconscious decision to avoid information altogether due to the anxiety it provokes. This is particularly dangerous in contexts of health or financial information, where avoidance can have serious real-world consequences (Howell & Shepperd, 2013; Walker, 2021; Munasinghe, 2025).
- 3. **The Imposter Syndrome Amplifier**: In academic settings, infophobia exacerbates feelings of intellectual inadequacy. The more a student discovers, the more they realise what they don't know, creating a cycle of anxiety that hinders, rather than helps, the research process.

4. Digital Fatigue: As identified in recent studies on adolescent literacy (Aziz et al., 2024), intensive digital consumption leads to reduced attention spans and cognitive fatigue, which are core components of the infophobia response. The medium itself contributes to overwhelm.

This phenomenon is fundamentally an affective response to information overload, centering on the emotional and anxiety-provoking dimensions of engaging with modern information ecosystems.

The Library as a "Sanctuary" in the Information Storm

If infophobia is the modern disease of the information age, then libraries are uniquely positioned to be a primary source of the antidote. This requires a shift from merely providing access to actively curating, mediating, and mitigating the stress of information.

1. From Gatekeepers to Guides: The Pedagogical Imperative

The classic model of information literacy instruction, which focus on teaching the mechanics of database searching, is necessary but no longer sufficient. Combating infophobia requires teaching the mindset of a savvy information consumer. This includes:

- **Curatorial Literacy**: Helping patrons develop strategies to filter and select, not just search. This involves teaching the use of RSS feeds, alert systems, and other tools that deliver quality information to the user, rather than the user drowning in a sea of data.
- **Critical Evaluation as a Stress-Reduction Tool**: Framing source evaluation not as an arduous checklist but as an empowering method to quickly reduce the field of play. As breakers of information barriers, librarians can demystify the process, showing patrons how to use triage sources efficiently, thereby reducing the anxiety of the unknown.

2. Promote Digital Wellness and Cognitive Sustainability

Libraries have always been spaces for contemplation and deep thought. In the digital age, this must be intentionally cultivated. This can involve:

- **Programming on Digital Minimalism**: Hosting workshops that teach patrons how to manage their digital consumption, curate their online feeds, and develop healthier relationships with technology.
- **Designing "Low-Stimulus" Zones:** Creating dedicated quiet zones that are not just silent, but are explicitly designed for focused, deep work without digital interruptions, serving as a sanctuary from the hyper-stimulation of modern life.

3. Personalized Navigation and Cognitive Support

The human touch of a librarian is more valuable than ever. The reference interview transforms into a therapeutic-like interaction where the librarian must first assuage anxiety before attempting the query. This involves active listening, breaking down complex tasks into manageable steps, and affirming the patron's feelings of being overwhelmed, validating that their infophobia is a rational response to an irrational system.

Navigating Real-World Constraints: The Implementation Challenge

The proposed role of libraries as an "antidote" to infophobia is aspirational However, its implementation must be reconciled with significant practical limitations, particularly in contexts such as Sri Lanka.

•Funding and Infrastructure: The vision of "Low-Stimulus Zones" requires reliable electricity and Internet a non-trivial challenge in a country experiencing frequent power cuts. Libraries often operate with limited budgets for database subscriptions, meaning

they cannot always provide the "curated" access they aspire to. The digital divide is not just cognitive but profoundly physical and economic.

- **Staffing and Training**: Transforming librarians from "gatekeepers to guides" requires continuous professional development. However, public libraries in Sri Lanka often face staffing shortages and have limited resources for training staff in advanced digital literacy or cognitive support techniques. Asking a lone librarian managing a small, under-resourced branch also to act as a "digital wellness" coach is a significant challenge.
- **Cultural and Linguistic Scaling**: Developing "Personalised Navigation" for a multilingual population requires resources and tools that are often designed for monolingual, Western contexts. A Sri Lankan librarian must be a guide not only to information but also through the complexities of three-language information ecosystems, a task for which few standardised models exist.




Figure 1: Mapping the Library's Role as an Antidote to Infophobia

The Path Forward: Contextual Research and Advocacy

The LIS field must formally recognise and study infophobia to develop evidence-based strategies that are sensitive to local contexts. Further research is urgently needed to understand its prevalence and impact across different demographics, particularly in Global South nations where the information explosion interacts with pre-existing linguistic, educational, and infrastructural challenges.

For libraries in Sri Lanka and similar contexts, the path forward involves strategic advocacy and partnership. This means:

- 1. Lobbying for recognition that library funding is a public health imperative for cognitive well-being.
- 2. Developing low-bandwidth, offline-first digital literacy tools that can function even with intermittent infrastructure.
- 3. Creating community-specific curation models, such as verified, multi-lingual information hubs on local issues (e.g., agriculture, health, citizen rights) to reduce the chaos of the open web and social media.

In a world saturated with information, the ability to find peace, focus, and truth is not a luxury; it is a necessity. By acknowledging infophobia and consciously evolving to meet this new and urgent human need even in the face of significant constraints, libraries can solidify their role as vital clinics for the overwhelmed modern mind, from the global north to the global south.

A Case in Point: Infophobia in the Sri Lankan Context

While infophobia is a global phenomenon, its manifestations are acutely visible in developing nations like Sri Lanka, where the digital leap has been rapid and often uneven. The concept of a "cognitive divide" (Wurman, 2001) is starkly evident in this context. Consider the empirical observations from public and university libraries scattered across the island wide:

- The Multilingual Overload: A Sri Lankan university student is often required to navigate information in Sinhala, Tamil, and English. The challenge isn't just volume, but the cognitive load of filtering and synthesising across languages and cultural contexts. A single search on a topic like "constitutional law" or "economic policy" yields contradictory results in all three languages, leading directly to Analysis Paralysis. The fear is not just of choosing a poor source, but of misinterpreting a culturally or politically nuanced text.
- The WhatsApp Infodemic: In a context where mobile data and WhatsApp are primary information channels, Information Avoidance takes on a unique form. During the 2022 economic crisis, citizens were bombarded with a relentless stream of unverified messages about fuel queues, medicine shortages, and political unrest. The anxiety was so profound that many individuals reported deliberately leaving community WhatsApp groups a clear behavioural indicator of infophobia, to preserve their mental well-being, even at the risk of missing critical, practical information (Walker, 2021). This is infophobia driven by survival anxiety.
- The Digital Native vs. Digital Naïve Divide: Contrary to assumptions, Sri Lankan youth (Aziz et al., 2024) are not immune to Digital Fatigue. While they are proficient with social media interfaces, many lack the critical digital literacy to evaluate scholarly articles or identify sophisticated misinformation. In a focus group at a Sri Lankan university, students expressed feeling "stupid" and "left behind" when accessing international academic portals, directly amplifying Imposter Syndrome. They have the access, but not the analogous skills to manage the cognitive toll.



Pre-Conference Webinar 4: "Innovating for Impact: Commercialising Library Services in the 21st Century University"

University of Kelaniya Contributes to EU-Funded Erasmus+ NSIS Project




The Library of the University of Kelaniya is proud to be a partner in the Erasmus+ Capacity Building in Higher Education (CBHE) project titled "Developing Information, Research, and Digital Skills for Business, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship in India, Sri Lanka, and Nepal (NSIS)". Coordinated by the Technological University of the Shannon (Ireland) and supported by a €799,933.28 grant from the European Union, this three-year initiative (2024–2027) brings together leading universities and institutions from Ireland, Germany, Greece, Romania, India, Sri Lanka, and Nepal. The project seeks to strengthen the capacity of Library and Information Science (LIS) professionals to support research, innovation, and entrepreneurship within South Asian higher education.

A key milestone in the project was the 2nd Didactic and Scientific Working Group Meeting, held from 15–20 September 2025 at Dresden University of Technology, Germany. Representatives from 14 partner institutions gathered to review project progress, refine curricula, and plan strategies for digital learning implementation. The University of Kelaniya was represented by Dr. C.C. Jayasundara, Librarian, and Dr. W.M.T.D. Ranasinghe, Senior Assistant Librarian. A major outcome of the meeting was the development of content outlines for ten NSIS training modules. Notably, both Dr. Jayasundara and Dr. Ranasinghe served as team leaders in designing two of these core modules, underscoring the library's active contribution to advancing regional LIS education and professional development.








Reading Camp for Primary School Students

"Tamilthoothu": A Photo Exhibition Celebrating the Legacy of World Tamil Research Conferences

In conjunction with the Sixth Annual International Tamil Research Conference held on 15 August 2025, the Library of Tamilology organised a five-day photo exhibition titled "Tamilthoothu" ("多山设立委员"). The exhibition featured a curated selection of eighty archival photographs from earlier World Tamil Research Conferences conducted by the International Association of Tamil Research (IATR), with special emphasis on the Fourth World Tamil Research Conference (1974) held in Jaffna. The display highlighted the historical significance of these global scholarly gatherings while preserving their enduring legacy.

The exhibition was led by Dr. (Mrs.) Maithili Visakaruban, Deputy Librarian, with the dedicated support of a committed library team comprising Mr. Y. Kesavan and Mr. K. Sajanthan (Assistant Librarians), and Mr. M. Kohulan, Mr. V. Nisanth, and Mr. R. Thananchayan. Their collaborative efforts were instrumental in organising and curating the archival materials.

The archival images were sourced from the Vithiananthan Library and from individual contributors, ensuring a rich and diverse collection. The exhibition was for Through the Lens of History mally inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor, and drew enthusiastic participation from faculty, students, conference delegates, and members of the public, who commended the initiative for bringing Tamil scholarly and cultural history vividly to life.

Through the Lens of History

The International Association of Tamil Research (IATR) was established in 1964 by Rev. Fr. Xavier S. Thaninayagam to promote and advance research on Tamil language and culture worldwide. At the time, Fr. Thaninayagam was serving as Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Head of the Indian Studies Department at the University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur (1961–1966). His vision for a global forum dedicated to Tamil studies took shape during the 1964 Orient Scholars Conference in New Delhi, where he convened a meeting of Tamil scholars and proposed the creation of an international body. This initiative led to the founding of the IATR in New Delhi later that year.



The First World Tamil Research Conference under the IATR was held in April 1966 at the University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur, and was ceremonially inaugurated by the Malaysian Prime Minister, Tunku Abdul Rahman.



The Second Conference took place in Chennai in January 1968, opened by the then President of India, Dr. Zakir Husain



Two years later, in July 1970, the Third Conference was hosted in Paris, organised by Dr. Malcolm Adiseshiah, then Deputy Director-General of UNESCO.



The Fourth World Tamil Research Conference was held in Jaffna from January 3 to 9, 1974, and was ceremonially opened by Rev. Fr. Thaninayagam himself. This event was primarily academic, attended by renowned Tamil scholars from across the world.





Complementing the scholarly discussions, cultural programs were also organised. On 9 January, a vibrant parade was held in Jaffna featuring floats, including a striking miniature replica of "Annapoorani Ammaal", the Valvettithurai-built brigantine that had famously sailed to the USA and Sri Lankan Tamil Scholar Arumuka Navalar, who identified and published many ancient Tamil texts, including Thirukkural Parimelazhagar Urai and Nannool. A grand cultural evening followed on 10 January, showcasing the participation of international Tamil scholars and artists to a broader audience.

The initiative aims to foster a culture of reading, writing, and idea sharing within the university community, making the library not only a place for learning but also a space for inspiration and creativity.








Book Exhibition at the Main Library

The exhibition provided an excellent opportunity for the university community to explore and acquire valuable literary works, promoting reading and cultural appreciation among students and staff.








Inauguration of Emeritus Professor Sarath Kotagama's Collection at the Science Library, University of Colombo








Her Excellency Ms. Miyon Lee, Ambassador of the Republic of Korea to Sri Lanka, Visits the Science Library






SEUSL Library Hosts Special Event on Empowering Your Voice: A Library Event on Democracy


